Chinese Americans

About the Survey


In November 2019, researchers from PRRI and AAPI Data released a landmark report on Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) workers in California. The survey of 2,684 AAPI California residents explored experiences and perspectives of workers, many of whom are struggling with poverty.

Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders are the fastest-growing racial groups (and working-age population) in California and the nation. Between 2010 and 2017, most new immigrants to California came from Asia.

As with other racial and ethnic groups, the research tells the story of "two Californias" — one where some AAPI workers are financially stable and another in which AAPI workers report struggle significantly. This brief highlights key findings relevant to Chinese American workers in California from the full report.

AAPI California Workers Struggling with Poverty Within Each Region

In California, the highest proportion of Chinese American adults reside in the Bay Area (46%) and Los Angeles (30%).





Key Findings



Nearly FOUR IN 10 AAPI workers in California are struggling with poverty.

Chinese Americans make up one-third of those AAPI workers struggling with poverty. Chinese American workers born in the U.S. are more likely to report struggling with poverty than those who are foreign-born.





Economic Hardships and Concerns

Share of Chinese American workers in California who experienced hardships in the past 12 months:



31% helped parents or in-laws financially



26% reduced meals or cut back on food to save money



18% put off seeing a doctor or buying medicine



16% had difficulty paying rent or mortgage



(\$) 15% were not able to pay a monthly bill

Share of Chinese American workers in California who are:



worried that they or someone in their family will be unable to afford housing **53**%



worried that they or someone in their family will lose health insurance 48%



worried that they or someone in their family will be deported 8%

Views on the American Dream and Economic **Mobility Among Chinese Americans in** California

55% still believe in the American Dream (if you work hard, you'll get ahead), compared to 62% of all AAPI Californians.

46% of struggling Chinese American workers in California believe in the American Dream.

39% believe it is harder to achieve the American Dream here than in other states.

46% would encourage young people to leave their community for better opportunities.

64% agree that hard work is not a guarantee of success, compared to 55% of all AAPI Californians.

Hardships on the Job

Share of Chinese American workers in California who said they or someone in their household experienced the following in the past 12 months:







Experienced racial discrimination or bias

Required to work overtime without pay 23%







Felt vulnerable due to immigration status 11%



Injured on the job



Had wages withheld by an employer without cause

Views on the Economy, Employers, and Policymakers

Share of Chinese American workers in California believe that:

The U.S. economy unfairly favors the wealthy 79%

Public officials do not care what they think 81%

Employers generally see them as replaceable 78%

It is important to organize so that employers do not take advantage of them 72%

加利福尼亞州的亞裔美國人和太平 洋島民的工作生活和掙扎

華裔美國人

調查簡介


2019年11月,PRRI 和AAPI Data 的研究人員發佈了關於加利福尼亞州亞裔美國人和太平洋島民(AAPI)工人的一項里程碑報告。對 2,684名 AAPI 加州居民的調查探索了工人的經驗和觀點, 其中許多人正在貧困中掙扎。

亞裔美國人和太平洋島民是加利福尼亞州和全美增長最快的族裔群體(和工作年齡人口)。在 2010 年至 2017年期間,加利福尼亞州的絕大多數新移民來自亞洲。

與其他種族和族裔一樣,這項研究講述了"兩種加州人"的故事 — 其中一種為經濟上穩定的 AAPI 工人,另一種 AAPI 工人則報告生活艱難。本簡介著重介紹與報告全文所述的加利福尼亞州的華裔美國人工人相關的重要發現。

每個地區內在貧困中掙扎的AAPI加州工人

在加州,華裔成年人住在灣區和洛杉磯的比例最高,分別為 46% 和 30%。





重要發現



在加利福尼亞州,每10 位AAPI 工人中就有將近4人在貧困中掙扎。

在貧困中掙扎的 AAPI 工人中華裔佔三分之一。美國出生的華裔工人比外國出生的華裔工人更有可能報告在貧困中掙扎。





經濟困難與顧慮

在過去的12個月在經歷過困苦的加州華裔工人份 額:



▲ 31% 的人在經濟上幫助了父母和姻親



26%的人為了省錢減少了餐飲次數或食量



Vo 18% 的人推遲看病或買藥



16% 的人在支付租金或抵押貸款方面有困難

(3) 15% 的人無法支付每月賬單

擔心自己或家人將發生下列情況的加州華裔工人份 額:



將無法負擔住房 **53%**



將失去健康保險 48%



將被遞解出境 8%

加州華裔對美國夢和經濟流動性的看法

55%的人仍然相信美國夢(如果努力工作,就會獲得成 功) ,而且所有AAPI加州人中有62%的人相信美國夢.

46% 處於掙扎中的加州華裔工人相信美國夢.

39% 的人認為在加州比在其他州更難實現美國夢.

46% 的人鼓勵年輕人離開社區去尋找更好的機會.

64%的人同意,努力工作並不能保證成功,相比較,55% 的人相信美國夢
